

# M RECREATION CENTER



In 1986, Muskingum proudly opened the doors of its new Recreation Center. Since then, students, faculty, staff, athletes and the New Concord

community have utilized this 117,000 square-foot facility. Furthermore, Phase I of the renovation of the Rec Center was completed in August, 2007, and features the multi-million dollar Cooper Wing, a football locker complex, the Kalnow Center, a state-of-the-art athletic training center and state-of-the-art basketball locker rooms.

The beautiful Rec Center features a 2,500-seat varsity gymnasium; a 7,000 square-foot weight room that includes 15 half racks (each with 450 lbs.), 50 pairs of dumbbells, three ham-glute machines, two back stations, 13 jump/stretch/flex band stations; and a 1,100 square-foot cardiovascular fitness area that features treadmills, steppers, elliptical cross trainers, bikes and circuit training machines all are located in the Recreation Center.

This elevator-equipped facility features racquetball courts; batting cages; an aerobics room; a lap pool; locker rooms for athletic and visiting teams, officials, faculty and students; seminar rooms; staff offices; a laundry room and an athletic training room.

Long considered one of the nation's strongest regional academic institutions, Muskingum's enthusiasm for the future has never been stronger.



Muskingum has experienced a period of intensive strategic planning and resource development. This endeavor has resulted in sound financial growth, effective resource investment, and unprecedented campus construction.

Under the leadership of President Dr. Anne C. Steele, Muskingum has entered a period of intensive growth and renewal in facilities. These include three new, state-of-the-art campus landmarks: Philip and Betsey Caldwell Hall, the 32,000 square-foot home of speech, theatre, electronic journalism and communications programs, dedicated in 2004; the Walter K. Chess Center, the 22,000 square-foot home of student activities, fitness, and recreation, dedicated in 2008; and Otto and Fran Walter Hall, the 30,000 square-foot home for music, foreign languages and the Center for the Advancement of Learning, with dedication expected in 2011.

Completed "campus of the future" facilities projects also include the newly-constructed Ruth and John Neptune Art Center and multi-million dollar renovations and restorations to Muskingum's athletic complex and historic academic buildings. Offering more than 40 undergraduate and interdisciplinary majors, including Nursing, Engineering Science and Graphic Design and 10 pre-professional programs, three master's degree programs, and the Muskingum Adult Program, the university serves the east central Ohio community and beyond.

Founded in 1837 by Presbyterians of Scotch-Irish descent, Muskingum continues to be associated with the Presbyterian Church (USA) and takes its church-relatedness very seriously, offering courses in religion and philosophy and a full complement of religious-life programs.

Many 20th-century national and world leaders are among Muskingum's alumni: pioneer astronaut and U.S. Senator John Glenn; Ford Motor Company CEO Philip Caldwell; Depository Trust Company Founder and CEO William Dentzer; U.S. Ambassador and Goodyear Tire CEO Charles Pilliod; Robert Warner, the Sixth Archivist of the United States; AT&T Executive Vice President Harold Burlingame; and Jack Hanna, television zoologist. Nineteenth-century alumni include William Rainey Harper, founding President of the University of Chicago.

Dr. Elizabeth “Bea” Zicha, the sixth all-time winningest active coach in Division III and 25th across all divisions, has built a national-caliber volleyball program at Muskingum University.

While at Muskingum, Zicha has more overall and Ohio Athletic Conference wins than any other coach in the league. She has posted a record of 610-283 (.683 winning percentage) including a record of 170-81 (.677) in league matches. She has earned six OAC Championships, three National Collegiate Athletic Association quarterfinal appearances and one third-place NCAA finish.

Zicha has guided the Fighting Fish to 23 years of at least 17 wins or more. Numerous student-athletes have been honored with conference, regional and national accolades under her tutelage. Zicha was recognized for her volleyball accomplishments at Muskingum when the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches’ Association inducted her into the OHSVCA Hall of Fame in 2001.

Zicha’s special honors include: four OAC Coach of the Year awards, three Great Lakes Region Coach of the Year awards and four Indiana County Coach of the Year awards.

Off campus, Zicha has been a featured speaker at the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches’ Clinic and has spoken at the American Volleyball Coaches’ Association Convention and Clinic. Other notable career activities include: speaker at numerous OHSVCA clinics, Court Coach at OHSVCA Elite Camp, life-time member of OHSVCA, National Federation Volleyball official and USA official and coach.

Zicha earned her B.S from Indiana University of Pennsylvania and her Ph.D. from West Virginia University.
