1. Approved minutes of October 4th meeting as amended.
2. Approved amended agenda of October 18th meeting.

Curricular Review:

3. Acted on the following proposals from the Science Division as follows:
 - a. Unanimously approved the addition of CHEM 1XX: Organic/Biochemistry (4 credits) to the permanent offerings. (30 day approval required).
 - b. Tabled discussion of the following items pending receipt by the CC of the proposed Nursing Curriculum.
 - i. Add BIOL 1XX: Anatomy and Physiology I (4 credits) to the permanent offerings.
 - ii. Add BIOL 1XX: Anatomy and Physiology II (4 credits) to the permanent offerings.
 - c. Deferred discussion of the following items pending resolution of items in *b* above.
 - i. Drop BIOL 228: Human Anatomy (3 credits) from the permanent offerings.
 - ii. Drop BIOL 129: Physiology of Exercise (3 credits) from the permanent offerings.
 - iii. Adjust the Biology major to reflect the changes in b-e above.
4. Consider the following changes from the Psychology Department:
 - a. Unanimously approved the addition of PSYC 2XX: Lifespan Development (3 credits) to the permanent offerings. (30 day approval required).
 - b. Deferred discussion of the proposal to “remove PSYC 151: General and Experimental Psychology from the Scientific Understanding category of the LAE” until the next meeting. The Science Division requested time to discuss this proposal and give feedback prior to CC consideration.
5. Consider the following changes from the Math and Computer Science Department:
 - a. Received the proposal to allow CPSC 220 to count as a CPSC elective.
 - b. Tabled discussion of the proposal to add CPSC 1XX: Add CPSC 1XX: Introduction to Software Development (3 credits) to the permanent offerings and to the Communicating in the World LAE category. Since this proposal may have a significant impact on the Communicating in the World LAE category, the CC recommends that the MACS department discuss this proposal with the Modern Languages department. Additionally, the CC recommends modifying the description of the proposal to clarify the differences between the new course and CPSC 111.
