
### Ukraine, the Campus, and the World

The Black Student Union, Women in Politics, and the John and Annie Glenn Fellows create engaging events for **Black History Month** and Women's History Month.



"New Year New Art" featured members of the Artist Colony of Zanesville who lost their works and studios when a tragic fire struck the historic Masonic Temple.


