The works, large-scale sculptures using straw, plaster, raw clay, pine, steel, and plastic patio chairs, will reside in the foyer of Walter Hall and the English suite in Cambridge Hall, respectively. 
STUDENT EXHIBITION

DISCOVER THEATRE DAY






SEOSO: STUDENT CONDUCTOR

As part of the opening performance of the Southeastern Ohio Symphony Orchestra, junior music education major Jackie Bradshaw conducted Reinhold Glière's "Russian Sailor's Dance." Jackie currently serves as apprentice conductor for the group and has also directed the Muskingum Spirit Band, Concert Choir, and Brass Ensemble during her time on campus. ART CONFERENCE AND RESEARCH TRIP

As part of his current sabbatical, Professor of Art, Yan Sun, recently attended the National Marine Art Conference of the American Society of Marine Artists (ASMA) in Albany, New York. His painting, "Morning Glow" was also published in the magazine of ASMA Volume XLIV 2023. While in the area, Prof. Sun visited The Albany Institute of History & Art, the Buffalo AKG Art Museum, the New York State Museum, the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts, and Musee National des beaux-arts du Quebec. He created plein air painting sketches onsite at Lake Erie, a garden in Montreal, Saint Joseph's Oratory of Mount Royal, and Thousand Island Lake in Canada.





MVSW: LIVING MUSIC

In addition to our student ensembles, Muskingum University offers a number of auditioned groups that allow our more students perform alongside advanced to accomplished community musicians, and professional musicians from across the region. Muskingum Valley Symphonic Winds recently presented Living Music, featuring a moving program of works by living composers. As guest soloist, Muskingum Instructor of Tuba/Euphonium, Justin White, performed "Capriccio" for tuba and winds by Mike Forbes. Other highlights on the program included music for the video game Skyrim, by Julie Giroux and "Eternal Flame," which was commissioned in 2023 to commemorate the 100th season of the Zanesville Memorial Concert Band. In addition. the concert included two powerful pieces composed in memory of those lost too soon: "I Am," by Andrew Boysen, written to celebrate the life of a high school band member, and "Requiem for the Unarmed," written by Kevin Day in 2020 to honor the memory of George Floyd and countless other Black lives lost to racial injustice in the United States. If you missed this concert, the group will perform two more concerts this year (February 11 and April 28).
