ART & DESIGN CLUB BUILDS BRIDGES THROUGH COLLABORATIVE HOMECOMING PROJECT

This year, members of Muskingum's Art & Design Club set out to make a bold statement: art is for everyone. Throughout the semester, the group has been organizing creative activities for students, but during Magenta Homecoming they turned their attention to alumni, hoping to spark connection and visibility across generations of Muskies.

To do so, the club designed an interactive "Paint by Numbers" experience using colored sticky notes. Positioned near the registration table on Saturday morning, students invited alumni to write their name, class year, and favorite Muskie memory on a note, which they then placed on a large, labeled grid. As the morning unfolded, each memory became part of a vibrant pixel-art collage revealing our athletic logo in full color and full spirit.

The project was facilitated with support from Interim Vice President for Institutional Advancement, Matt Andrew, who praised the students' initiative and their desire to build meaningful connections with alumni. Inspired by the success of the event, Andrew is exploring ways to expand similar collaborative efforts to other student organizations in the future.






A CHRISTMAS CAROL
