Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship

This scholarship is to honor the lifetime work of Senator Barry Goldwater, who served his country for 56 years as a soldier and statesman. An award of up to \$7,500 will be given to those chosen from the applicants that apply before the last Friday in January. See eligibility requirements at:

Boren Awards

Boren Scholarships are available for many of the study abroad programs you may be interested in:

Maximum awards are determined by duration abroad:

- Up to \$20,000 for 25-52 weeks (preferred)
- Up to \$10,000 for 12-24 weeks
- Up to \$8,000 for 8-12 weeks (STEM majors only)

Diversity Abroad Summer Scholarship

Gilman Scholarships

A US Department of State scholarship given to recipients of any federal aid of \$5,000 for study abroad programs. There is eligibility criteria listed on their website, so make sure to visit their site to check it out.

A recipient of this scholarship will have a service-learning component to the itinerary of their journey. They will receive \$2,000 to help finance their international trip. The deadline to apply is March 2. Find out more information at:

Fund for Education Abroad

Applicants from underrepresented groups and those who wish to travel to non-traditional locations are given preference, but anyone can apply. Up to \$10,000 is given away to applicants that apply before September. On average, 71% of recipients are first-generation college students and 82% identify as people of color. In addition, this foundation has one application that links into over 30 different scholarships between \$1250 and \$10,000. Programs must be at least 28 days in length. Applications are taken November-September. For more information visit:
